Donating is Simple

- When you deliver grain to your local elevator, tell the manager how many bushels you want to donate to "Our Neighbor's Daily Bread".
- Tell the elevator manager to sell your donated bushels, and he will send a check to "Our Neighbor's Daily Bread", in care of the Montana Grains Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit foundation.
- The Montana Food Bank Network will access the Montana Grains Foundation funds to purchase flour when needed for hungry families in Montana.

**Montana's Bounty
Was Meant to Be Shared**

Today, more and more Montanans must rely on emergency food programs, food pantries, soup kitchens and shelters to put food on the table for their families. The vast majority are women and children, the elderly, working poor and people with disabilities. Your donation to the Our Neighbors Daily Bread program will provide flour to meet Montana Food Bank Network needs across the state.

Our Neighbor's Daily Bread is a wheat-to-flour donation project created by the Montana Grain Growers Association in response to a plea from the Montana Food Bank Network for much needed flour to feed Montana's hungry.

Answering the call, Our Neighbor's Daily Bread (ONDB) was formed, a collaborative effort involving Montana's farmers, Montana Grain Growers Association (MGGA), Montana Grains Foundation, Montana Food Bank Network and participating grain elevators across the state.



A bushel of wheat produces 60 to 73 loaves of bread.

Farmers are invited to donate the proceeds from any number of bushels simply by visiting with their local elevator manager and informing him of the donation amount. The donated bushels will be sold when the farmer sells his share and a check for the donated amount will be sent by the elevator at the time of settlement to Our Neighbor's Daily Bread, in care of the Montana Grains Foundation, a not-for-profit entity of MGGA.

When flour is needed, the Montana Food Bank Network contacts the Montana Grains Foundation with an order. Corresponding bushels are purchased, milled, bagged and loaded into Montana Food Bank delivery trucks at a Great Falls flour mill and distributed through the nearly 200 partner agencies in Montana that provide food for those in need.
